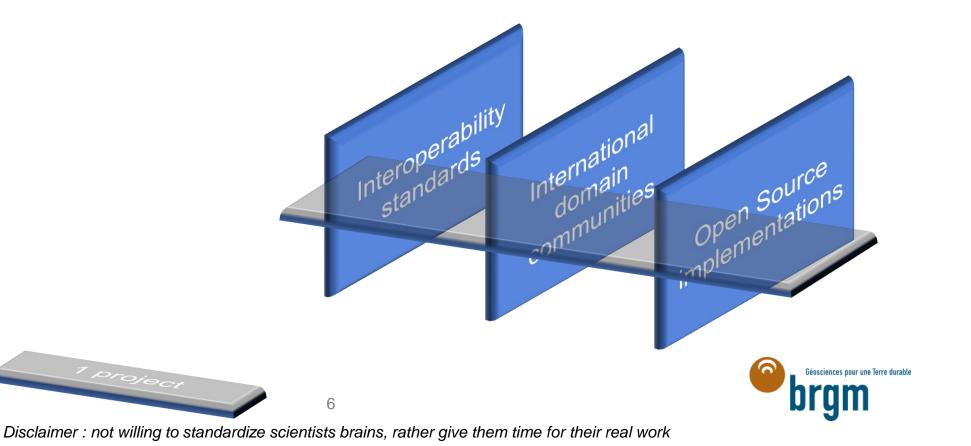


Interoperable / FAIR data in a project – How ?



The challenge is to have that ecosystem implemented in the project

- It shall be the DNA of every project to build on it
 - And not add / shoehorn interoperability / FAIR principles at the end to expose content. Interoperability principles
 <u>are not only for exposing data</u> to the outside. They are crucial <u>within the system itself.</u>

and make the project implementation part of the ecosystem

- If the project meets limitations / needs for enhancement
 - It feedbacks to the group that makes sense

- Examples: 0
 - OGC API for Observations (OGC SensorThings API) test : CSV was not part of the output formats. BRGM worked with Fraunhofer / DataCove to specify it. Now it's part of an extension and also one of the reference implementation.

International

- BRGM in Observations & Measurements -> Change Requests -> Co-Lead of the OGC/ISO standard 0 revision -> many systems ask us for Guidelines on how to implement it
- Positive "side effect"
 - Contributions to those core elements are visible : this also lead to publications or visible contributions to the communities. It also help those doing core IT work in the tools to have their contribution visible.

Work sequence

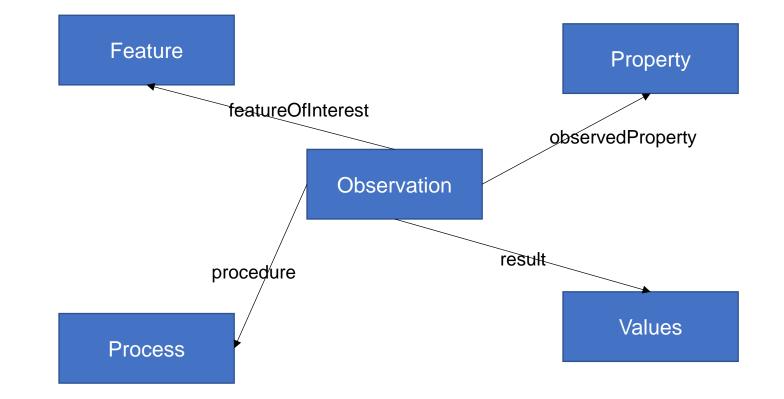
- 0°/ Use Case
 - IT 101, Best Practices => no Use Case, no project ☺
- 1°/ clarify data considerations with domain experts
 - Semantics, provider, transformations etc...
 - Don't only follow the GUI mermaids
 - UX/UI limited to GUI is nice but only looking at this leads to forgetting data semantics. Good data semantics & semiology leads to a better UX/UI.
- 2°/ identify which API to ingest/expose what
 - Knowing what data the projects handles and what are the expected UseCase will help identify the API
- GUI
 - Could work alongside the others, provided a proper feedback loop exists with steps 1 and 2



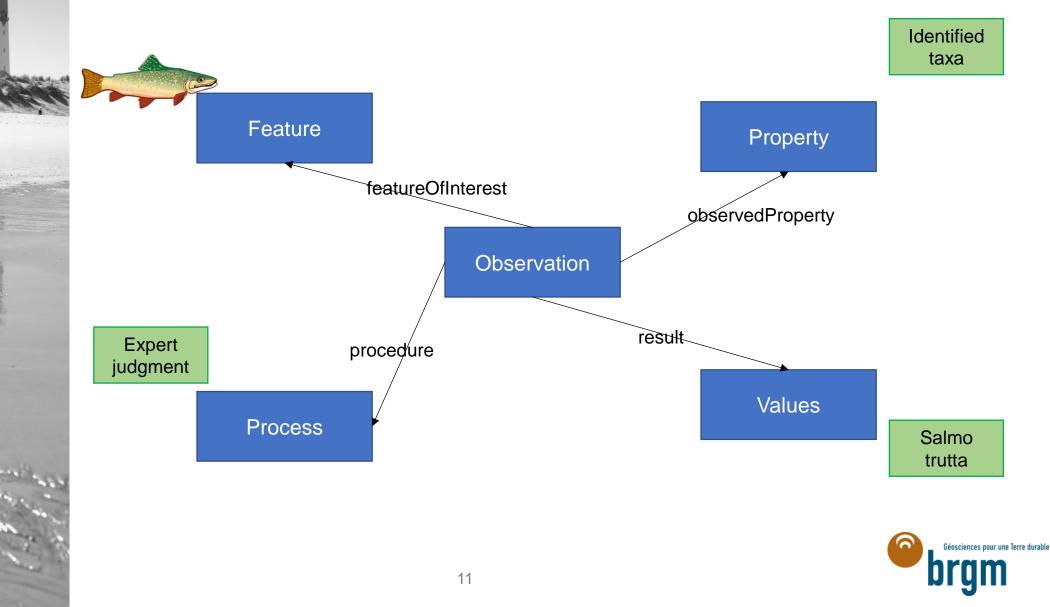

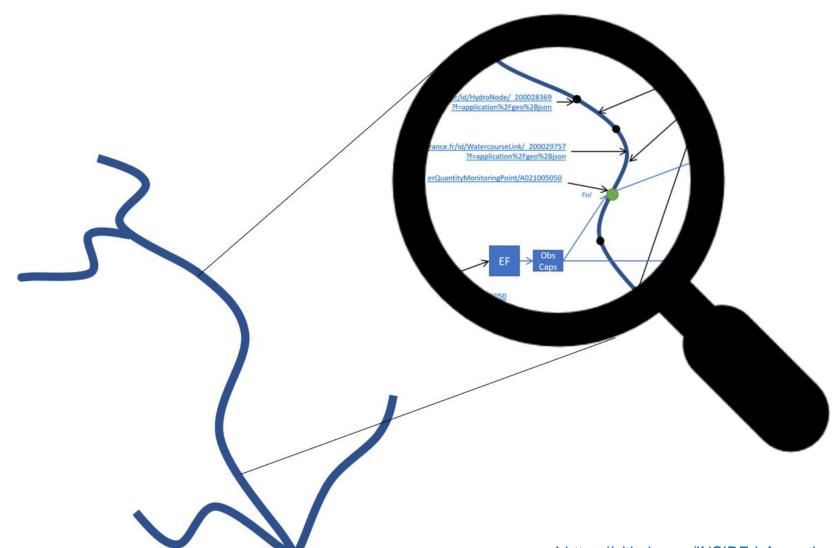

OMS level 1 example : surface water quantity (height gage)

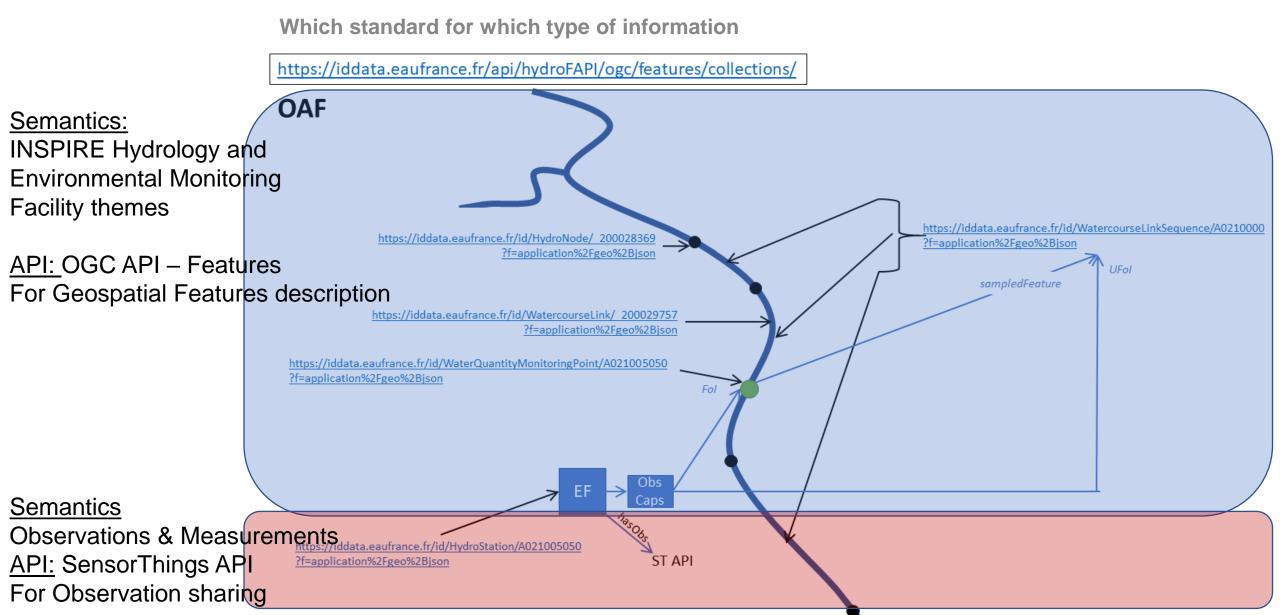

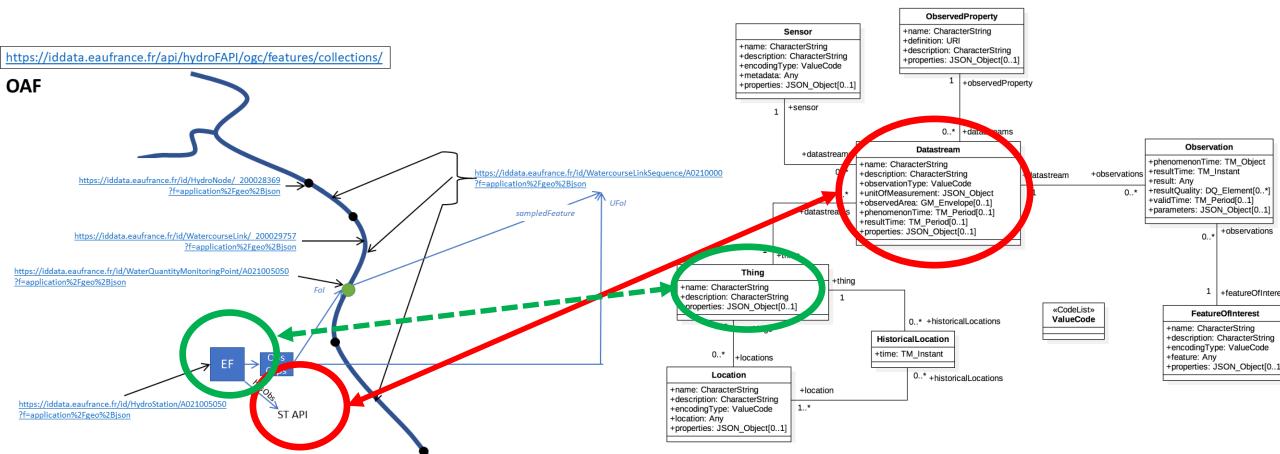

Chemical concentration - Simplified (implemented) model => mapped to ST API

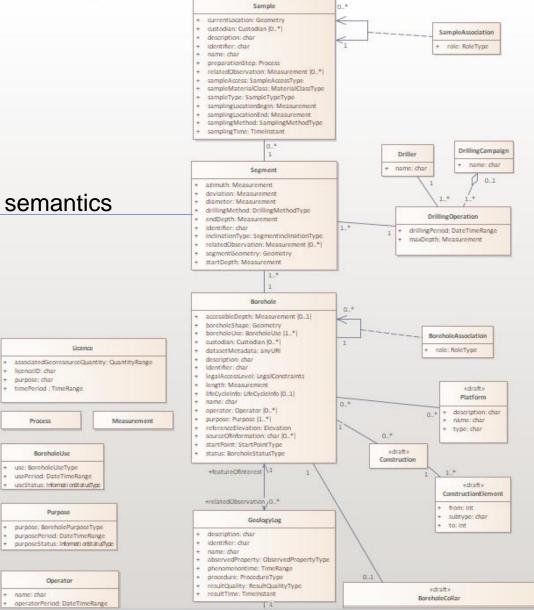

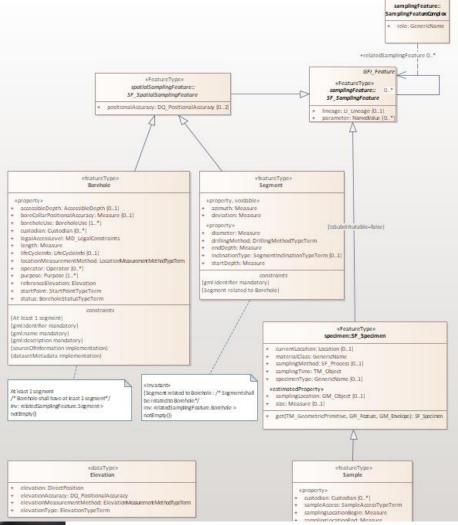

In the logical model, the Borehole, Segment, Sample cascade from step 1°/ is modelled building on classes from Observations & Measurements

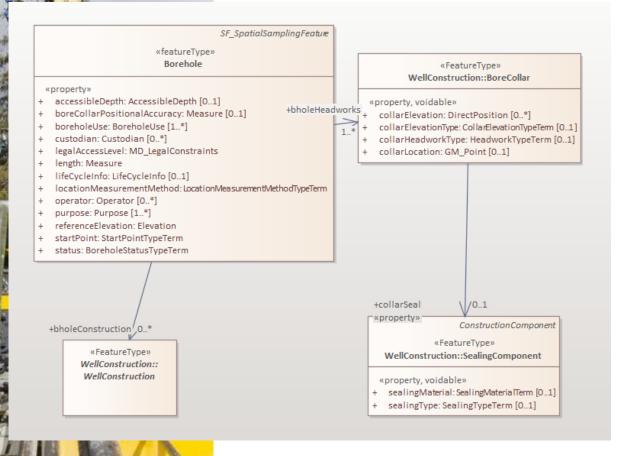

In the logical model, Borehole is a subtype of SF_SpatialSamplingFeature from Observations & Measurements ...

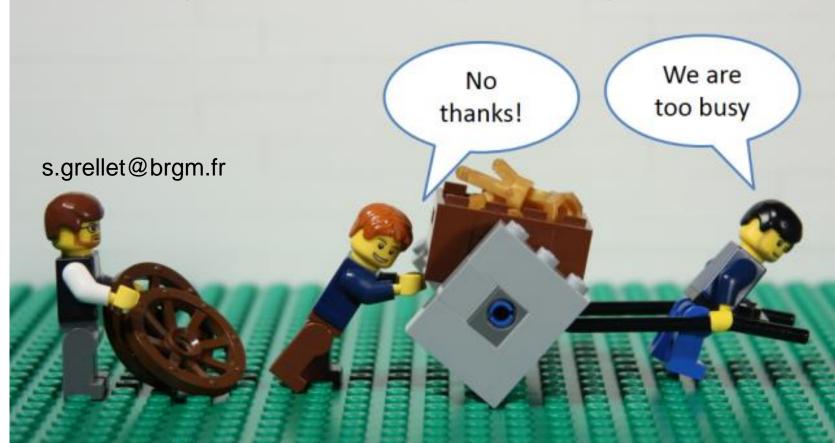
... and Borehole constructions elements from step 1°/ are reusing classes defined in GroundWaterML2.0
